## **Core competencies and skills**

- Utilizing 2D and 3D computer software, including AutoCAD, Revit, Sketchup, Adobe Suite and other design programs.
- Collecting and analyzing data and research in the development of clients' requirements, needs and goals for residential and commercial projects.
- Preparing working drawings and details consisting of partition, furniture, lighting, power and finishes plans.
- Identifying life, safety, zoning and building code issues, utilizing programming to meet those guidelines and restrictions.
- Differentiating material/finish suitability by name, appearance, aesthetics, durability, abrasion resistance, visual and psychological impact.
